The meeting will begin promptly at 9:30 a.m. with the first section which is called Audience Comments. The Audience Comment portion of the agenda is where individuals may comment on matters that concern the District. Each individual is limited to three (3) minutes for such comment. The Board of Supervisors or Staff is not obligated to provide a response until sufficient time for research or action is warranted. IF THE COMMENT CONCERNS A MAINTENANCE RELATED ITEM, THE ITEM WILL NEED TO BE ADDRESSED BY THE DISTRICT MANAGER OUTSIDE THE CONTEXT OF THIS MEETING. The second section is called Business Administration. The Business Administration section contains items that require the review and approval of the District Board of Supervisors as a normal course of business. The third section is called Business Items. The business items section contains items for approval by the District Board of Supervisors that may require discussion, motion and votes on an item-by-item basis. The fourth section is called Staff Reports. This section allows the District Manager, Engineer, and Attorney to update the Board of Supervisors on any pending issues that are being researched for Board action. Occasionally, certain items for decision within this section are required by Florida Statute to be held as a Public Hearing. During the Public Hearing portion of the agenda item, each member of the public will be permitted to provide one comment on the issue, prior to the Board of Supervisors' discussion, motion and vote. Agendas can be reviewed by contacting the Manager's office at (813) 933-5571 at least seven days in advance of the scheduled meeting. Requests to place items on the agenda must be submitted in writing with an explanation to the District Manager at least fourteen (14) days prior to the date of the meeting. The final section is called Supervisor Requests. This is the section in which the Supervisors may request Staff to prepare certain items in an effort to meet residential needs.

Public workshops sessions may be advertised and held in an effort to provide informational services. These sessions allow staff or consultants to discuss a policy or business matter in a more informal manner and allow for lengthy presentations prior to scheduling the item for approval. Typically no motions or votes are made during these sessions.

FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS

Call to Order

Mr. Roethke called the meeting to order and read roll call.

SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS

Audience Comments

There were no Audience members present.

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of the Minutes of the Board of Supervisors' Regular and Landowner Meetings held on November 25, 2014

On a Motion by Mr. Karpay, seconded by Ms. Jaxheimer-Mills, with all in favor, the Board approved the Minutes from the Board of Supervisors' Regular and Landowner Meetings held on November 25, 2014 for Cordoba Ranch Community Development District.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of the Operation and Maintenance Expenditures for November and December 2014

On a Motion by Mr. Noble, seconded by Mr. Karpay, with all in favor, the Board ratified the Operation and Maintenance Expenditures for November 2014 (\$13,789.11) and December 2014 (\$49,535.50) for Cordoba Ranch Community Development District.

(Mr. Woodley arrived while the meeting was in progress at 3:05p.m.)

FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Administer Oath of Office to Newly Appointed Officers

Mr. Roethke administered the oath to Mr. Woodley, and Mr. Woodley responded in the affirmative. Mr. Roethke also noted that Mr. Woodley is eligible to receive \$200.00 compensation to attend Board meetings, up to a maximum of \$4,800.00 per year. Mr. Woodley declined compensation.

SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Pond Update

Mr. Roethke presented the pond inspection report to the Board. There were some minor issues with algae over the past month, but those have since been treated. Mr. Roethke noted that the fountain installation is tentatively scheduled for the first week of February. A discussion ensued regarding several items within the report. The Board would like to have ValleyCrest bush hog the area around pond # 320 and also remove excess trash around pond # 200.

SEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Proposal for Storm Grate Replacement

Mr. Roethke presented a proposal to replace a storm grate on pond # 240A. The Board would like to see additional quotes for this item before approving this proposal.

EIGHTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Proposal for Erosion Repair for Pond #110

Mr. Roethke presented a proposal for erosion repair at pond #110. The Board would like to see additional quotes for this item, as well as, for erosion repair for pond #130 before approving this proposal.

NINTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Landscaping Update

Mr. Roethke provided an update on several landscape issues from the previous meeting. Most notably, Mr. Roethke reached out to Cornerstone regarding the magnolia trees that are not performing well. Cornerstone mentioned that these trees were installed in early 2013 and are out of warranty. Field Operations Manger, Tyree Brown, who is a certified arborist, still maintains that these trees were planted too deep. Cornerstone responded that the soils in the islands where these are planted are not percolating and are restrained by the curbs, which causes a constant wet condition and will drown the trees. The Board would like to see a solution for how to resolve this issue, including whether or not the tees can survive if they are re-planted higher. If so, they would like to see a plant count and a proposal from ValleyCrest.

TENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Ratification of Erosion Repair Proposals

Mr. Roethke presented a proposal for erosion repair that requires Board ratification.

On a Motion by Mr. Noble, seconded by Mr. Woodley, with all in favor, the Board ratified the proposals from ValleyCrest for erosion repair on pond # 210 and tree removal on pond # 120 at a total cost of (\$1,075.00) for Cordoba Ranch Community Development District.

ELEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Proposal to Remove and Replace Pine Trees

Mr. Roethke presented a proposal to remove and replace pine trees that requires Board ratification.

On a Motion by Mr. Noble, seconded by Mr. Woodley, with all in favor, the Board ratified the proposals from ValleyCrest to remove and replace 2 pine trees at a total cost of (\$710.00) for Cordoba Ranch Community Development District.

Mr. Roethke also distributed a proposal from ValleyCrest to rake out soil and replace 200 sq. feet of bahia sod at pond #180. This is to repair some hog damage.

On a Motion by Mr. Noble, seconded by Mr. Lovo, with all in favor, the Board approved the proposal from ValleyCrest for sod repair at pond # 180 at a total cost of (\$200.00) for Cordoba Ranch Community Development District.

TWELFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Compatibility Plan with Cypress Creek Nature Preserve

Mr. Roethke presented a document regarding a compatibility plan with Cypress Creek Nature Preserve to the Board. Mr. Amaden added additional comments regarding the details of this agreement. This is a county requirement that was not signed by the original developer. Mr. Amaden entertained various questions from the Board. Mr. Robin suggested several minor changes to be made to the document.

On a Motion by Mr. Karpay, seconded by Ms. Jaxheimer-Mills, with all in favor, the Board approved the Compatibility Plan with Cypress Creek Nature Preserve, pending review by District Counsel with execution by Board Chair for Cordoba Ranch Community Development District.

THIRTEENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Discussion Regarding No Trespassing/ Fishing Signs on CDD Ponds

Mr. Roethke informed the Board that there is a resident that requested No Trespassing/No Fishing signs be installed on the ponds near his home. Mr. Roethke presented a proposal for sign installation and reviewed that with the Board. A discussion ensued. As a stop-gap measure, the Board will ask the developer to install No Trespassing signs on the vacant lots next to this resident's home. Mr. Roethke will follow up with the Sheriff's office for information regarding sign placement and enforcement.

FOURTEENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of District Counsel Engagement Letter

Mr. Roethke presented an updated engagement letter from District Counsel. Mr. Robin added some comments regarding the details of this letter.

On a Motion by Mr. Noble, seconded by Ms. Jaxheimer-Mills, with all in favor, the Board approved District Counsel's engagement letter for Cordoba Ranch Community Development District.

FIFTHTEENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Consideration of Proposal for Website Services

SCOPE OF SERVICES:

Services provided by Consultant shall be to provide Client with the development, implementation, maintenance and/or the upgrading of its technological capabilities. Services may include, but are not limited to:

Out-of-Pocket Expenses:

In addition to professional fees, project related out-of-pocket expenses will be billed at cost. These expenses include, but are not limited to: airfare, mileage, public transportation, parking, lodging, meals, reproduction of documents, long distance telephone, fax, postage, clerical support, computer charges and express mail. These expenses will be invoiced along with fees and will be due and payable when invoiced.

Fees and expenses will be invoiced upon completion or monthly, as applicable, and will be due and payable when invoiced.

The monthly fees outlined herein shall be amended annually as reflected in the adopted General Fund Budget of the District. Such new fees, as authorized by the District's action to adopt the General Fund Budget, shall become a binding schedule of this Contract until otherwise changed by a subsequent action of the District.

The one-time charges outlined herein shall be subject to change in the future upon request of the Client for additional services. Such revised one-time charges will be provided to the Client for approval prior to commencement of any additional services.

CLIENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Client shall furnish all required documents, data and information relative to the project necessary for the Consultant to perform the duties of this Contract. In addition, Client shall provide timely services of its staff deemed necessary as the project progresses. Expenses incurred in providing this support shall be the sole responsibility of the Client.

TERM:

This Contract may be terminated as follows:

- 1) By the Client for "good cause" which shall include misfeasance, malfeasance, nonfeasance or dereliction of duties by the Consultant. Termination for "good cause" shall be effected by provision of a minimum of 30 days written notice to Consultant at the address noted herein;
- 2) By the Consultant for "good cause", which shall include, but is not limited to, failure of the Client to timely pay Consultant for services rendered in accordance with the terms set forth in this Contract, malfeasance, nonfeasance or dereliction of duties by the Client, or upon request or demand by the Board, or any member thereof, for Consultant to undertake any action or implement a policy of the Client which Consultant deems unethical, unlawful or in contradiction of any applicable federal, state or municipal law or rule. Termination for "good cause" shall be effected by provision of a minimum of 30 days written notice to Client at the address noted herein.

Consultant will be entitled to full compensation, pursuant to the terms of this contract, through the termination date. Consultant will make all reasonable effort to provide for an orderly transfer of all records of the Client to the Client or its designee.

NON-PAYMENT:

The failure of Client to pay any amount due within 30 days of presentation shall constitute good cause for Consultant to suspend services provided under this Contract until full payment is received.

NON-CONTINGENCY:

The payment of fees and expenses, as outlined in this Contract, are not contingent upon any circumstance not specifically outlined in this Contract.

LEGAL COMPLIANCE:

Consultant shall, for as long as Consultant is under contract to provide the services described herein, be responsible:

- 1) To ensure that the Client website remains in compliance with all applicable Florida Statues regarding the content and functionality of such website.
- 2) To provide for the long-term storage of email in compliance with all applicable Florida Statues regarding records retention.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- 1) All invoices are due and payable upon presentation. For invoices not paid within 30 days of presentation, interest on the balance due will be charged at the maximum legally permissible rate.
- 2) In the event collection proceedings become necessary, Client agrees to pay all costs including attorney's fees.
- 3) Abandonment or suspension of the project shall not relieve the Client of monies due for services rendered to the date of such abandonment or suspension. Such services shall be billed at the applicable stated rates or full lump sum amounts and

will be immediately due and payable upon determination that the project has been abandoned or suspended and that the Consultant has performed the services as outlined herein.

- 4) Ownership of web site, content, domain name and e-mail addresses, under all circumstances is that of the Client.

- 8) The Client shall, to the extent allowable under applicable law and except and to the extent caused by negligence or willful misconduct of the Consultant, agree to indemnify, defend, and hold the Consultant harmless from and against any and all claims, actions, suits, demands, assessments or judgments asserted and any and all losses, liabilities, damages, costs, court costs, and expenses, including attorney's fees, alleged or that Consultant may hereafter incur, become responsible for, or be caused to pay out arising out of or relating to (1) damages caused to the Client by hacking or any other unauthorized access to the data or content on the Client web site or e-mail server; (2) damages caused by unauthorized use of Client's web site content or e-mail server by any third party; and (3) any claim for taxes or other charges which may be made against the Consultant which are the primary responsibility of the Client. The indemnification provided for herein shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which the Consultant may be entitled and shall continue after the Consultant has ceased to be engaged under this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed to limit Client's sovereign immunity provided in s. 768.28 F.S.

This Contract shall represent the entire agreement between the Consultant and the Client. Both Consultant and Client understand and agree with the terms and conditions as set forth herein.

- 9. The primary contact person for the special district for purposes of communication from the Department of Economic Opportunities.
- 10. A code of ethics adopted by the special district, if applicable, and a hyperlink to generally applicable ethics provisions.
- 11. The adopted budget of the special district, in addition to budget amendments as required by with section 189.418, Florida Statutes.
- 12. The final, complete audit report for the most recent completed fiscal year and other audit reports required by law or authorized by the governing body of the special district.
