The second section is called Business Administration. The third section is called Business Items. The business items section contains items for approval by the District Board of Supervisors that may require discussion, motion and votes on an item-by-item basis. The fourth section is called Staff Reports. This section allows the District Manager, Engineer, and Attorney to update the Board of Supervisors on any pending issues that are being researched for Board action. Occasionally, certain items for decision within this section are required by Florida Statute to be held as a Public Hearing. During the Public Hearing portion of the agenda item, each member of the public will be permitted to provide one comment on the issue, prior to the Board of Supervisors' discussion, motion and vote. Agendas can be reviewed by contacting the Manager's office at (813) 933-5571 at least seven days in advance of the scheduled meeting. Requests to place items on the agenda must be submitted in writing with an explanation to the District Manager at least fourteen (14) days prior to the date of the meeting. The final section is called Supervisor Requests. This is the section in which the Supervisors may request Staff to prepare certain items in an effort to meet residential needs.

Public workshops sessions may be advertised and held in an effort to provide informational services. These sessions allow staff or consultants to discuss a policy or business matter in a more informal manner and allow for lengthy presentations prior to scheduling the item for approval. Typically no motions or votes are made during these sessions.

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of the Minutes of the Board of Supervisors' Regular Meeting held on April 28, 2015

On a Motion by Mr. Noble, seconded by Mr. Karpay, with all in favor, the Board approved the Minutes from the Board of Supervisors' Regular Meeting held on April 28, 2015 for Cordoba Ranch Community Development District.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of the Operation and Maintenance Expenditures for April 2015

Pond Update

Mr. Roethke presented the pond maintenance report to the Board and informed the Board that the erosion repairs that were previously approved for Briken Construction have now been completed.

Mr. Roethke presented a proposal from Aquagenix to continue monthly pond maintenance services at a slightly increased rate.

On a Motion by Mr. Noble, seconded by Mr. Woodley, with all in favor, the Board approved the proposal from Aquagenix for pond maintenance services at a cost of \$1,034.00 per month for Cordoba Ranch Community Development District.

A discussion ensued regarding creating access easements to treat pond numbers 290 and 300. The District Engineer will take a look at the neighborhood grading plan to see if there are any other additional issues with access to ponds as lots are platted and built out.

Landscaping Update

Mr. Roethke informed the Board that ValleyCrest switched account managers for Cordoba Ranch and there were some issues over the past couple weeks with right-of-way ditches not being mowed. These issues have since been rectified.

Mr. Karpay mentioned that the landscape architect from Standard Pacific is still working on coming up with a plan for landscape installations in the future.

Mr. Roethke presented a completed bid form for landscape and irrigation maintenance services from ValleyCrest. If the Board was interested in running a landscape and irrigation maintenance RFP in the future, this bid form would be used from all vendors that bid on the project, and Mr. Roethke recommended using these numbers for budgeting purposes. A discussion ensued and the Board decided to go out for bid for landscape and irrigation maintenance services.

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



The following report is for June to illustrate what has changed from May and what to expect through July and the coming months.

The photos this month were taken on Wednesday 06/09/2015.

The ponds were treated on 06/04 this month. In the photo's you will see some results of the application. Algae continues to be the biggest challenge and will be for the summer months due mainly to the warm temperatures and shallow water.

The ponds this month are still low, littoral zones are slightly covered with water. A proposal for Aquascaping on the littoral zones that would benefit most is attached with this months report. We began by quoting the most significant shelves prone to low water level exposure, these are the areas that would impact and benefit the community the most. This does not include all the beneficial plantings Cordoba may eventually want to perform but a good start. Also, the quote is not "all or nothing". We would happy to discuss a smaller scope or completing the project in phases as your budget allows.

What we found: significant algae bloom from May.

What we did: Algae was treated on 06/04 and has turned brown.

What to expect: the algae should further decline and drop out within a week from treatment.



Recommendations & Notes: This area might be better served if the entire shallow north end of the pond were planted instead of trying to maintain an open water view. (See Aquascaping Proposal).

Date: 06/09/15 Pond #110

What we found: Very nice. Minor grasses algae.

What we did: Algae was treated and grass treatment along boarder.

What to expect: We would love the pond to stay this way year round, but algae is likely to bloom again.



Notes:

What we found: Overall looking good. Torpedo grass in middle still showing. Sticks present.

What we did: treated for algae and perimeter grasses.

What to expect: I expected the torpedo grass to have lain down by now, but it's dead and will disappear soon.

Recommendations & Notes: With new construction occurring here on this pond and many others throughout Cordoba, it may be a good time to look at a manual vegetation removal visit on some of these ponds that where "out of sight" last year. We will provide a quote for that service with next months report.



The entire swale/ditch to the south of this pond is recommended for Aquatic plants. There is not enough water here to maintain a pond. (see attached Aquascaping proposal).

What we found: Better still than last month. Algae & some submersed weeds around perimeter.

What we will do: continue to focus on algae.

What to expect: As summer continues to heat up, algae blooms are likely.

Pond #140



Recommendations & Notes: This pond would benefit from a band of aquatic plants around the perimeter, this could help lower nutrient levels as well and minimize erosion.



Duck Potato -Sagittaria lancifolia

Duck potato is an immersed plant. Its large leaves and conspicuous flowers make it easy to find in the wild. Duck potato gets its name from its potato-like, underground corms that sometimes form. Duck potato has large, firm, lance-shaped leaves, which are typically four inches wide and up to two feet long. The leaf bases taper to the stem. The leaves grow as a fan-like rosette from underground rhizomes. Duck potato flowers are typical sagittaria flowers: showy and white, with three petals. Flowers are extended on thick stalks that are often a foot or more above the leaves.





Pickerelweed - Pontederia cordata

Pickerelweed is a very common and widely recognized native. It occurs throughout Florida and flowers year-round. It is a prolific grower and can cover large areas. Pickerelweed typically grows to about 2 or 3 feet tall. Its leaves are large (up to 5 inches wide) and are usually twice as long. Leaf shapes are variable, but are usually lance-shaped.





The two plants above are what we recommend for your application...however, there are many other options for you to consider including: Spatterdock (yellow water lily), Jointed spike rush, and Thalia (fire flag). Feel free to contact me for additional information.

- 4. # 180: easements between Lots 12-13, Block 3; south of Lot 16 Block 3; Lots 2-3, Block 4; and Lots 4-5, Block 4 (all include pipe)
- 5. # 185: easements between Lots 12-13, Block 3; south of Lot 16 Block 3 (include pipes)
- 6. # 230: adjacent to the ROW (200' frontage)

If homeowners are erecting fences in these easements, then we need to notify them that they are prohibiting maintenance of the ponds. The plat does contain a note that says "drainage easements shall not contain permanent improvements, including....fences....". This note should also be on each deed of lots with drainage easements.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The virtual attendants will receive guests via the kiosk located at the Main gate. The guest, vehicle, and license plate are monitored with audio and video feeds, which are typically archived for approximately 30 days. Guests will need to utilize the left hand side of the entrance lane and pull up to the kiosk and wait for the attendant to acknowledge them.

GUEST ACCESS 6 a.m. to 11 p.m.

Guests arriving between 6 a.m. and 11 p.m. will be asked to provide identification and the name of the resident they are visiting. If the guest refuses to provide identification or the name of the resident they are visiting, the virtual attendants will make a note with the time and date in the log book, and will permit the guest to enter.

GUEST ACCESS 11 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Only guests who have been registered by a resident will be provided access between 11 p.m. and 6 a.m. The virtual attendants will ask guests to provide identification and the name of the resident they are visiting. In the event a guest is not registered and upon request by the guest, the virtual attendant may contact the resident using the contact information on file with the virtual attendant or verify the identity of the resident using the PIN issued to the resident. If the resident is unavailable by phone, the guest will be denied access.

GATE ARMS

The District Manager is authorized to modify the hours the gate arms remain open during the day at the direction of the Board of Supervisors.

LOSS OF POWER OR INTERNET OR GATE MALFUNCTION

In the event of a loss of power, the gates open automatically to allow for free entrance and exit of all vehicles. The gates will also open should internet service be lost.

In the event the entrance or exit gates malfunction (e.g., fail to open or close all the way, or open and close continually), or if the video kiosk is not working, the Cordoba Ranch CDD District Manager should be contacted at 813-933-5571.

DISTRIBUTION OF GATE ACCESS WINDSHIELD STICKERS

Three (3) Gate Access Windshield Stickers ("stickers") will be issued to the owner of each home. Additional stickers may be purchased at a cost of \$25.00 per sticker. Residents may purchase up to two (2) additional stickers, for a maximum issued of five (5) per home. Stickers can only be purchased for individuals that reside in the same address as the homeowner, and they must have a registered vehicle at that same address. In the event you sell your vehicle, you should remove the sticker from the vehicle and purchase a new one for your replacement vehicle, as the stickers are not transferable from one vehicle to another. Replacement stickers will only be issued if the resident notifies the office of the District Manager of the sticker number that will be replaced. This will ensure that Envera can deactivate the original sticker before the replacement has been issued and activated.

When purchasing additional or replacement sticker(s), a check or money order (no cash) for \$25.00 must be written out to "Cordoba Ranch CDD" and can either be mailed or delivered in person to the office of the District Manager at 3434 Colwell Avenue, Suite 200, Tampa, FL 33614. Proof of residency will be required to purchase additional stickers, such as a utility bill showing your name and Cordoba address, or a home lease showing your name and Cordoba address. Upon receipt of the check or money order, the sticker(s) will be mailed to the resident via standard mail, or they can be issued or picked up at the office of the District Manager at the address provided above.
